

Dear Overbrook Community,

Given the strange times that we are in right now, I had to make a decision about the release date for the yearbook. I consulted with the Jostens representative and Mr. Lee and we decided that a fall release date for the yearbook would be the best decision. Initially, I was holding off doing this because I was hoping we would go back to school and be able to get more content for the yearbook. Unfortunately, that did not happen; therefore, the 2019-2020 Yearbook will not be released until the fall. My hope is to be able to get graduation pictures in the yearbook. Mr. Lee sent a letter out stating that if the Governor allows it, Overbrook will have a graduation ceremony during the first week of August. If that happens, we will have pictures from the graduation in the yearbook and the yearbook will be available 8 weeks after the August graduation ceremony.
